Background: Higher Education for the Twenty First Century Project is a credit given to the Government of Sri Lanka by the International Development Association (World Bank) amounting to US\$ 40 Mn for the period of 5 years from 2011 to 2016.

Objective: The main objective is to enhance the capacity of higher education system and to deliver quality higher education services in line with equitable, social and economic development needs of the country.

Project Components: The HETC is organized with four components.

- Developing a Sri Lanka Qualification Framework and Quality Assurance and Accreditation System for Higher Education in Sri Lanka
- Promoting relevance and quality of teaching and learning in all 15 Universities
- Strengthening the alternative higher education by developing the Advanced Technological Institutes of the SLIATE
- Strengthening human resources of the higher education system

University Development Grants (UDGs)

The aim of this sub-component is to strengthen the economic and social relevance of university programmes. To achieve this, the UDGs support activities to

- enhance ICT skills of students;
- improve English Language skills of students;
- strengthen the soft skills of students;
- promote ethnic cohesion among students and staff;
- improve quality and relevance of External Degree Programmess (EDPs)

The University of Jaffna received a grant of Rs.20Mn under EDP and activities commenced recently.

Quality & Innovation Grants (QIGs)

The objective of this sub-component is to make additional resources available to support strategic and innovative plans to enhance the quality of teaching and research. Unlike the UDG, which target universities, the QIG will be accessible to and implemented by, specific study programs and/or departments.

Activities supported by the QIG are quite diverse, and they fall into one of the four windows created to account for that diversity.

- Window One: Undergraduate Programs Arts and Management Faculties
- Window Two: Undergraduate Programs All other Faculties
- Window Three: Postgraduate Research Programs

• Window Four: Research Dissemination and Commercialization Projects

Two study programmes of the University of Jaffna, namely Management studies & Commerce (Window One) and Bioscience (Window Two) received grants of Rs. 20Mn and Rs. 25Mn respectively under QIG (Round 1). Agreements were signed recently and activities are expected to commence soon.

Human Resource Development (HRD):

This sub-component has been developed to support human resource development in the higher education sector by assisting the higher education institutes to strengthen the quality of their academic-staff through suitable postgraduate programmes, and all staff through short term training programmes. The main components are:

- MPhil/PhD Training for Universities
- Masters Training for SLIATE ATIs
- Short Term Training
